INTO THE BIBLE
In the message, Pastor Jim talked about God desiring a personal, intimate relationship with every person. There are two sides to every relationship. Let's look at the greatness of our God and our response to His greatness.
<ol> <li>Read Psalm 8.</li> <li>A) What is the significance of this Psalm starting and ending with the same phrase?</li> </ol>
B) Verse 2 says God uses the words of babies and infants type to establish His strength and defeat enemies, what do you think this means?
C) In verses 3 & 4, what question does the writer of this Psalm ask?
D) We don't deserve the love and care that God has chosen to bestow upon us, but not only that, in verses 5-8, what do you see here that God has given us right to?

Let's look at how God uses this idea of in His majesty and glory He fulfills this truth of using the weak for His purpose and Glory
<ul><li>2. Read 1 Corinthians 1:26-31</li><li>A) In verse 26, what type of people do we see that Paul is talking to in this verse?</li></ul>
B) In verses 27-28, Paul shows what God's plan is to reach the world. What did he plan to do with these three types of people?
C) in Verse 29, why did we see that God chooses to use the "useless" for His purposes?
We saw in Psalm 8 that God is majestic and His glory is High above the heavens. Here in 1 Corinthians we are reminded that God is great and uses whatever He chooses from babies and infants, to the weak and powerless for His glory. We are reminded that if we boast, we should always boast in the Lord.
3. Read Psalm 63:1-8.
As we started this lesson off, we read that relationships are a two-way street. God has shown us His majesty and glory. He is worthy to be worshiped and desires to be in a relationship with us. He wants to use our weakness for His glory. He will not force us to spend time with Him and allow Him to grow our relationship. Let's look at how David, "a man after God's own heart", lived his life growing his relationship with God.
A) In verse 1, how desperate was David to spend time with God?
B) In verse 2, David had spent time in God's presence seeing the awesomeness of God. How do you think this shaped David's view of God?
C) As we spend time with God we learn about him, in verse 3, what does David's Knowledge of God's love cause him to do?
D) In verse 5, what does David say knowing God does for his soul?
