

DIGGING DEEPER – As we're seeking revival in our own lives, what are some areas in your life that God is working on your humility?

PRAY

3. Read Matthew 7:7-8. The words ask, seek, and knock in the original language actually means to keep on asking, keep on seeking, and keep on knocking. That means we must persevere in prayer.
 - A) Knowing this, how does this style of praying apply to seeking revival in your own life?

4. Read Psalm 34:15 & 17.
 - A) In these verses, when we have humbled ourselves and we pray, what has the Lord promised to do?

DIGGING DEEPER – As we're seeking revival in our own lives, does your prayer life look like the asking, seeking, and knocking we read about? Why or why not?

SEEK HIS FACE

5. As we look at seeking His face, we will focus on the ideas of desiring to be in His presence and surrender to God. Read Colossians 3:1-2.
 - A) In seeking to be in God's presence, there can be distractions in our everyday. How do these verses encourage us to keep our focus on seeking the face of God?

6. Read Hebrews 11:6.
 - A) What does God promise to do when we seek out His face?

7. Read Psalm 37:4-5.
 - A) As you find yourself in the Lord's presence, God begins to shape and mold the desires of your own heart. In these verses, when we learn to trust Him, what does He promise to do?

DIGGING DEEPER – As we're seeking revival in our own lives, are there areas in your life that you find as distractions that get you off focus?

DIGGING DEEPER – As we’re seeking revival in our own lives, are there desires of your heart that you need to surrender to God so that He can act in your life?

TURN FROM WICKED WAYS

If we choose to humble ourselves, spend time praying to God for revival, and surrender our will to God, then God in His mercy will reveal areas in our lives where we need to repent. Revival won’t come until we complete this last step.

8. Read 1 Peter 3:10-11. To “turn away” means to repent.
 - A) For us to see “good days”, what does God ask us to do?

DIGGING DEEPER – As we’re seeking revival in our own lives, what is God laying on your heart that you need to repent of?

9. Reread 2 Chronicles 7:14. Through the lens of the New Testament, our application of this passage is that if we humble ourselves, pray, seek His face, and repent, then God has promised that He will bring healing, restoration and revival.
